

NOVAWE will provide opportunities to learn not only how to navigate the 22 different WE obstacles, but also to understand the ample rules of WE. NOVAWE offers those just interested in improving their horsemanship and precision through WE practice opportunities through its introduction events and Play Days.

For those that develop ambitions for WE competition, NOVAWE will prepare members for the three phases of trials. First is to ride a WE dressage test, followed by an area obstacle course where each of at least 10 obstacles, and the transitions between them, are scored with value between 0 -10, plus collective marks. A CCI3* with Bad Eventer

Blogs have become a popular way for riders to chronicle their journeys with their horse and share their stories with others. A couple of years ago, I stumbled upon a blog titled "Tales from a Bad Eventer". Bad Eventer started TRYING to 3-day event as a young child, and has continued for, cough, decades being BAD at Eventing. She was based in Texas and recently relocated to Florida to follow her dream of competing in the Land Rover Kentucky Three Day Event. She is currently competing five horses at various levels and chronicles her story, with plenty of self-deprecating humor, in her blog at BadEventer.com. I highly recommend checking it out.

On July 5-7, Loch Moy Farm hosted the Maryland International + Horse Trials, which included the CCI3*-S that the U.S. Eventing Team used as their final preparation event for the 2019 Pan American Games in Lima, Peru. Bad Eventer decided this would be a good chance to compete two of her horses at the CCI3* level, and since she was coming up all the way from Florida, why not bring and compete all five of her horses?

After thinking things through, she put out a plea on social media for some extra help at Loch Moy. Having followed her blog for so

long and always looking for an excuse to head up to Loch Moy, I jumped at the chance to help! Saturday was the day she needed the most help with nine scheduled rides between all three phases on four of her horses. I arrived around 9:30 to help with the vet box for the two horses she was running in the CCI3*, Quatar Z (aka Zima or the Zebrasauras) and Atrax Robustus (aka Spiderwoman). After hanging out in warm up (and desperately trying to keep my fangirling to myself about being five feet away from Boyd Martin/ Tsetserleg and Lauren Kieffer/Vermiculus), Bad Eventer headed out onto the XC course with Zima and we headed to the vet box with everything ready to cool Zima down after his XC run for his TPR check. Unfortunately, Zima decided he was done at the giant drop just a few jumps in (for which I can't say I blame him - it was huge!), so we skipped the full vet box experience for him and headed back to the stalls to get Atrax ready for her XC run. They successfully completed the course together and Atrax quite enjoyed being doted on and sponged down with cold water

afterward. I wasn't able to stay all day but caught Toxicodendron's (aka Poison Ivy) show jumping round followed directly by XC. I had to leave before BadEventer wrapped up with the final horse of the day, Fizz (aka Foxy Cleopatra). Her fifth horse, a product of

I have never competed or had the chance to volunteer for an event at this level of competition, so, it was a learning experience. The amount of preparation that goes into these events for both the rider and the horse is humbling and requires either pure dedication or insanity or maybe a little bit of both. It is also a wonderful, supportive community where local competitors have a chance to chat with Olympians in the warm up ring and men and women compete as equals. I only hope my next horse likes the sport a little bit more so that I have another opportunity to immerse myself in this awesome community. #goeventing


