Competition Requirements

This show will be conducted and judged in accordance with the **United States Rules for Working Equitation**, Revision 7.1, dated March 20, 2024. The rulebook and appendices can be found at the following site: <https://usawe.org/rules>. **It is the competitor's responsibility to read and understand the rules prior to the competition.**

All competitors in USAWE-licensed shows **MUST BE USAWE MEMBERS**. Schooling rides will not be available.

Competitors interested in being eligible for lifetime medal awards and year-end awards **must be USAWE members.** Membership year is January 1st through December 31st.

All horses competing in USAWE Licensed competitions must be recorded with USAWE. A one-time fee of \$30 per horse includes lifetime performance tracking.

Riders with disabilities can apply for a Dispensation Certificate that approves the use of adaptive equipment and other allowances.

Dispensation Certificate: <https://usawe.org/competitions/rules/>

A horse/rider pair is considered an entry and is allowed to show in only one level/division per show. A horse may be entered twice in a competition if ridden by two different riders and in different levels. Exception: Two youth or one youth and one adult can share the same horse if competing in Level 1. A horse is limited to no more than six rides in one day.

*****Riders must compete in the division designated on their USAWE membership application for that competition year. Amateur and Youth riders may elect to compete in a different division in accordance with the USAWE Rider Division Policy when completing the membership application. (See Appendix G of the USA Rules for Working Equitation for complete details.) *****

*****Leaderboard points will be reported according to the level/division shown.*****

Riders must designate the level and division in which they want to compete on the entry form:

- Youth: Riders between the ages of 7 and 17 as of January 1.
- Amateur: Non-professional riders
- Open: Open to all riders. Professional riders may only compete in the Open division.

Riders must be correctly attired and horses properly presented in accordance with the U.S. Rules for Working Equitation. Show Management may, at its discretion, bar any person or horse from entering the arena if not suitably presented.

Open, Amateur, and Youth Divisions will be offered in L1-L7. They will be run together in each Level, but pinned separately.

Payment Policy

- PayPal is encouraged, but checks will be accepted. If you send a check, your entry will not be complete until the check is received.
- No entry may show unless it is paid in full.

Refund Policy

- If a competitor withdraws from this show on or before the show closing date of 5-25-24, the Show Secretary must be notified by email. A refund will be issued minus the office fee of \$35.
- If a competitor withdraws from this show after the closing date of 5-25-24, the Show Secretary must be notified in writing or by email before the start of the show. Show management may be able to provide a refund minus the office fee of \$35 on a case-by-case basis under one of the following conditions:
 - Withdrawal of a rider or horse is due to an injury, illness, or death. The withdrawal is accompanied by a veterinarian's or doctor's certificate.
 - If there is a wait list and the event manager is able to replace your entry.

Cancellation Policy

- If the entire event is cancelled by Frying Pan Farm Park, a full refund minus the office fee of \$35 will be issued with 14 days of cancellation.
- If the show is canceled due to pandemic, horse outbreak, or other acts of nature, a full refund minus the office fee of \$35 will be issued with 14 days of cancellation.

Entry Procedures

- A separate entry form must be completed for each horse-rider combination. **Entry Forms/Stabling Forms are electronic for this show.** No phone entries will be accepted.

- An entry form is not valid unless it is fully completed and has all the proper signatures, membership numbers, and horse information. An adult must sign for any youth rider.
- **Entries must be received by the closing date.** Entries received after the closing date will be assessed a **\$50** late fee and possibly be placed on a waiting list.

- Payment must be received for entry to be complete and accepted. Entries are accepted on a first-paid, first served basis.
- Youth exhibitors must indicate their date of birth on the entry form.
- Photocopy of a negative **Coggins** test, dated within one year of the end of the show, is required and must accompany the entry form and **be presented at the time of check -in**. Entries without a current (valid through show date) **Coggins** test result will not be accepted.
- Virginia State law required a current **Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI)** for horses arriving from out of state. Those horses cannot be on the Frying Pan Farm Park grounds without a health certificate. You must present a current CVI to the Stable Manager or an office staff person before unloading your out of state horse.

Prizes & Rosettes

- Rosettes will be awarded 1st to 5th place in each class for Open, Amateur, and Youth divisions for each trial: Dressage, Ease of Handling, and Speed.
- Champion and Reserve Champion rosettes will be awarded to the overall first and second place rider/horse teams in each level/division.
- Rosettes will be awarded to:
 - Best Turnout
 - Highest Dressage Score
 - Highest EOH Score
- Other prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the show management team.

Year End Programs

- Competitors who are members of NOVAWE will be able to count their scores from this show towards NOVAWE's Year End Awards.
- Competitors who are members of WE East will be able to count their scores from this show towards the WE East Show Series Program for 2024.

Stall Details

- Stalls are 10 x 12 with rubber mats. Stalls must be bedded with shavings or pellets or incur a \$45 additional charge. Additional shavings may be purchased from Frying Pan for \$10/bag.
- Electrical outlets at each stall.
- Hot/cold wash racks with overhead heaters
- Fan ventilation and insulated roofing
- Manure dumping in close proximity to barns.
- No nails, screws, or duct tape may be used in the stabling area. Blue painter's tape is acceptable.
- Wheelbarrows and wash stalls with hot water are available.
- Bring your own hay, buckets, and feed.
- Emergency contact information must be prominently displayed on all stalls housing an animal, including both cell phone and local contact information.
- **Do not use stalls you have not paid for.**

Stabling Details

- **Arrival:** Friday, June 7, 2024
 - Note: Horses that are attending the WE Clinic on June 7th may arrive after 3 pm on Thursday, June 6, 2024.
- **Departure:** Sunday, June 9, 2024 by 10:00 am
- **Early arrivals/late departures** must be coordinated with and approved by the **Stable Manager** and will be subject to an additional **\$35 charge per stall per day.**
- You pay the stall cleaning fee (\$15) one time.
- You do not have to strip the stall before you leave, but please pick it out during the show.
- This is a public park. There is no overnight security, but gates will be closed with a dummy lock.
- Please park trailers of horses stabling on site in the large lower parking lot.
- **Riders showing out of trailers will park in the areas near Barn A and behind Barn B. There is a \$20/day Grounds Fee if showing from a trailer. (This fee will be paid using the Stabling/Haul In Form.) If you have a larger rig, you can park in the lower parking lot.**

Non-Compete Horses

- Non-Compete horses are welcome to come to Frying Pan Farm Park on Thursday-Sunday, June 6-9, 2024. You only pay the stabling fees.
- You must register your Non-Compete horse on the Stabling Form. [NOVAWE Stabling/Haul In Form for Licensed Show & Clinic](#)
- All non-competite stabling fees are non-refundable.
- Current negative Coggins test within one year of the June 7th is required. This can be uploaded in the Jot Form.
- All out of state horses must present a Certificate of Health (CVI) to the show office before unloading horse from the trailer.

Arena Details

- All trials will be held in the Indoor Arena. It is 110' by 235' with magnesium-treated sand footing.
- Warm-up Arena: sand footing

General Information

- Lunch tray of sandwiches and/or wraps will be provided to competitors on Saturday.
- There are no food vendors at this facility. There are several delis and restaurants in the area:

- NOVAWE reserves the right to refuse an entry for any reason.
- **NOVAWE Licensed Show and Frying Pan Farm Park** reserve the right to maintain a **Harassment Free Environment** and may remove or refuse entry to any person(s) disrupting the show.
- No lunging allowed in the warm-up arena if there are any other horses and/or horse/riders present. There are other arenas on the property that can be used if not rented by some other organization.
- Only competitors and their trainers who have signed release forms are allowed on competition horses.
- Release forms for NOVAWE, USAWE, and Frying Pan Park are found on the Google Entry Form.
- If you have any issues at the show, address them to the Show Manager or TD only.

Additional Information about Frying Pan Farm Park (FPFP)

- **Dogs** and pets must be leashed and under control of the owner while on park property.
- **No Dogs** allowed in the Indoor Arena.
- There are NO hookups for overnight camping. You are welcome to stay in your trailer, but without access to power or water hookups.
- Restrooms are located in the Indoor Building. There are no showers.

- You are allowed to hack about the property, but are not allowed to school the cross-country fences without paying a schooling fee to Frying Pan Farm Park (FPFP).
- **Smoking and Firearms are prohibited** on FPFP property.
- **Alcohol beverages are prohibited** in the FPFP.

Rules and Regulations

Hold Harmless Clause: Understanding that horse sports may be hazardous and dangerous, even leading to permanent injury or death, each owner, rider, spectator, and other participant assumes any and all risk of loss or injury and agrees to hold harmless, regardless, the horse show personnel and the facility hosting the show. **NOVAWE, NOVAWE Licensed Show, and Frying Pan Farm Park** will not be responsible for any damage, injury, or loss to persons, horses, or property of exhibitors, spectators, or grooms. All local facility rules must be followed.

Motor Vehicle Operation: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above-described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Media Release Agreement: I agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, or other likenesses of me and/or my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion or benefit of the competition or sport. These likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in any way to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or misappropriation.

Youth Riders:

Riders under the age of 18 must wear protective headgear while mounted. It is recommended that all riders wear protective headgear. If you are over the age of 18 and choose not to wear a helmet, you understand the risks associated and assume all responsibility for your choice. You also understand there will be no medical personnel on site.

I hereby release and indemnify USAWE and agree to hold it harmless for any and all claims for money damages or otherwise for any Harm to me or my horse (if applicable), and for any Harm caused by me or my horse to others, even if the Harm resulted, directly or indirectly, from the negligence of USAWE, including all of the officials, officers, directors, instructors, volunteers, and affiliated organizations.

I hereby expressly assume all risks of Harm to me or my horse, including without limitation Harm resulting from the negligence of USAWE.

I hereby agree that if I am injured at this Event, the medical personnel treating my injuries may provide information on my injury and treatment to USAWE; this agreement hereby serves as a Release of Information thereto.

I hereby grant to USAWE all rights to use or assign photographs, videos, or other likenesses of me taken during the course of the Event for promotion or education purposes. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, copyright, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or misappropriation.

If the undersigned is a parent or guardian of a child under the age of 18, the undersigned consents to the child's participation and agrees to assume all of the obligations of this agreement on the child's behalf. I warrant that I have the legal capacity to assume all the obligations of this agreement on the child's behalf and will assume all liability therefore.
